



Find out about your Fawly Tower

The Fawly Tower project at All Saints Church Welborne has received Heritage Lottery funding to help to repair its ancient round tower.



We hope that this project will help to develop new relationships between your church and people in the Welborne neighbourhood. To do this we have been planning a series of community projects:

- **Researching the church and its neighbourhood**

If you have ever wanted to research the history of your neighbourhood, village, house, family, then this might be a good opportunity to get you started?

- **Developing heritage church walks**

If you are interested in the exploring the local area to develop walking trails, dog walks, and cycle routes then this might be for you?

- **Learning skills in maintaining historic buildings**

If you are interested in finding out more about looking after traditional Norfolk buildings, then give this a go!

We hope that you will be interested in finding out more about these projects and how you might want to be involved. We hope that this will be an opportunity to meet other local people and share in enjoyable group activities.

If you are interested taking part in activities about local walks, researching the history of the local area and families (including your own), and learning skills to maintain traditional Norfolk buildings. - **Researching the church and its neighbourhood**

The stories that the church and village hold have been only partially revealed. We hope that a team of volunteer researchers will work with a historical researcher to investigate this history and produce information for the village website, heritage guides, and local exhibitions.

- **Developing heritage church walks**

We hope to develop easy-to-follow 'heritage church trails' for Mattishall and Tudd Valley Parish Churches. Guides for walkers and cyclists will be developed in conjunction with local pubs and cafés, to encourage visitors to find out more about the history of the churches and use local services as part of their visit.

- **Learning skills in maintaining historic buildings**

We hope to introduce a group of volunteers to the skills necessary to care for our historic churches, and other buildings in our neighbourhood. Training workshops will take place whilst the repair work being conducted on the church building.

We are putting together our plans for the Fawlty Tower Project activities between now and November 2016. We hope that the work on the projects will take place 2017-2018.

So, it is not too late to suggest new projects that you think would be good for us to do. Please let us know if you would like to be involved.
